To display their interest in each, they have campaigned and raised money for programs such as Let the Band Play On; a fundraising campaign to purchase new instruments for Ames school children in grades 5 through 12, a library program called Project Smyles and a building expansion project for the Ames Public Library. As of August 2009, their efforts to create music opportunities have allowed them to raise \$280,000 while partnering with the Ames Education Foundation and the Story County Community Foundation. More than 30 new instruments have been purchased to strengthen school music programs thanks to their Let the Band Play On campaign.

The couple has actively participated in and held positions on several committees in the Ames area and due to their time and effort, many campaigns to support music and library funding have grown.
