Deer Creek Ceramics Huxley, IA Ruben's fascination with nature is a major influence in his work. His aim is to create pieces that inspire a smile. In 2005, he came in contact with clay for the first time at the Irvine Fine Arts Center in California where he learned wheel throwing. The hand building part of his work is a self-taught process.

His work is made with porcelain or stoneware clay. He wheel throws most of his pieces and then either alters them, adds texture, and/or creates sculptural details. Each piece is individually glazed and then fired in a reduction atmosphere at a temperature above 2100 degrees.

Each SCAP award recipient received a beautiful one-of-a-kind piece of artwork made by Ruben.
